Phonemic Awareness

- 'Heggity' curriculum

Reading/Phonics

- Jolly Phonics Program – explicit teaching of digraphs and associated spelling rules
- Tricky Words - practice reading for fluency
- Comprehension Strategies
- Decoding Strategies
- Development of reading stamina

Writing

- Book Making
- Application of Phonics knowledge/spelling rules
- Handwriting (letter formation)
- Tricky Words - practice writing for fluency
- Sentence structure
- Grammar – nouns, verbs and adjectives

Statistics and Probability

- Pose questions about themselves and familiar objects and events
- represent responses to questions using simple displays, including grouping students according to their answers
- use data displays to answer simple questions such as 'how many students answered "yes" to having brown hair?'

- Recording/showing your thinking using writing and pictures
- Applying new learning to unfamiliar contexts
- Discussing and justifying the reasonableness of an answer
