Welcome Back!

Welcome to the beginning of Term 3. We hope you have all enjoyed your holiday break. This term there are two new teachers joining our team. We welcome Anna into TR 10 and Beata into TR 6. We have a very busy term ahead with a variety of additional activities happening. These include the Footsteps dance program, Swimming and Sports Day.

English

The students will be focusing on the following text types: Information Report and Explanation. We will be looking closely at the structure, grammar and writing features of these two text types and there will be a focus on vocabulary and text organisation to improve writing. We will continue with our Jolly Grammar program focusing on teaching grammar, spelling and punctuation.

Mathematics

We will continue practicing our Recall Facts through a variety of hands on games and encourage students with families to practise at home. We will look at Location and Transformation where students will create and interpret simple grid maps to show position and pathways. We will be continuing our learning on Number and Place Value. We will be learning about Fractions and Decimals and three dimensional Shapes. We will also be learning about angles and being able to identify and classify a variety of them.

Humanities and Social Sciences

Students will be learning History in term 3 with a focus on local community as well as the role that people have played in its development. We will also be looking at journeys of exploration and European settlement in Australia. Curriculum topics also include the impact of navigators, explorers and traders on the societies they made contact with, including the impact of the interaction between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and others.

Science

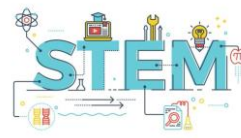
In Physical Sciences, we will be learning about how heat can be produced in many ways and can move from one object to another. We will also be learning about how forces can be exerted by one object on another.

Child Protection Curriculum

Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM)

Our STEM activities are integrated across the curriculum. Students will develop their problem-solving skills through designing, making, modifying and appraising depending on the student's interests and inquiry questions about the given topic.



In Technology we will identify and explore a range of digital systems and recognise different types of data and how the same data can be represented in different ways.
