# Year 6 term overview

# Term One 2023 | W41 & W42

Welcome to term one! We look forward to an enjoyable and productive year with your child for their final year of primary school. Students will continue to develop their curiosity, creativity and understanding in a positive learning environment. An overview will be posted on the school website each term.

## English

This term our focus is narrative text focusing on writing short stories. Students will explore the structure and text features of this style of writing, and focus on writing to engage the reader. They will apply appropriate grammar and editing skills during this learning.

Students will engage in whole class and small group reading. Our focus is on the 'Big 6' of reading and comprehension skills: predicting, questioning, visualising and thinking skills of a good reader. The reading program also links to the learning of the genre text types. Classroom teachers will provide individual reading goals to support your child's reading and comprehension development.

Spelling is a fortnightly cycle using the Jolly Phonics Spelling Program.

#### **Mathematics**

This term students will recognise the properties of prime, composite, square and triangular numbers. They will describe the use of integers in everyday contexts and solve problems involving all four operations

with whole numbers. Students will be exposed to the different ways to represent fractions and will model equivalent fractions. They will focus on selecting and applying efficient mental and written strategies to solve realistic problems using fluency, problem solving and reasoning.

In W42 students will also be studying the Cartesian plane, locating and describing points on the plane using ordered coordinates and all four quadrants. Students will use digital technologies to investigate angles on a straight line, angles at a point and vertically opposite angles, and interpret the results to find unknown angles.

# Science, Design and Technologies

This term's focus is Energy, exploring the generation and transformation of energy from varying sources and how electrical circuits work. Students will design and make a model of an energy efficient structure, demonstrating the use of electrical circuits and incorporating repurposed and sustainable materials.
